

COLLEGE PROFILE



Maharaja Agrasen College (MAC), believes in nurturing minds to imbibe learning in performance by imparting knowledge while exploring recent innovative and technical pedagogies. Our college has excelled in almost every field and has successfully earned grade 'A' as per NAAC. During the pandemic, MAC worked on providing a favourable online teaching-learning environment by designing and developing the online learning portal, organising faculty development programs, workshops, seminars and webinars. While focusing on a holistic approach towards teaching-learning techniques, MAC successfully conjoined moral learning and richness of the latest technology. In continuation with its nation-wide fame, in the latest survey of India's best colleges conducted by India Today and Nielson Company, Maharaja Agrasen College has secured 28th rank amongst educational institutions nationwide. And in adding yet another feather to its cap, the college has been placed at position 48 in the National Institutional Ranking Framework conducted by Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India in India Ranking 2021.

Our responsibility towards society has led us to have student faculty associations in the form of NSS and its projects like AKSHAR, SYAHI, ABHI, SAMARTHYA, etc. and also the Girls NCC as its latest action program.

The Placement Cell offers various opportunities to interact with visiting companies in the college campus where large number of students have been benefitted.

MAC has been nurturing the creativity and potential of its students by allowing them to express and explore themselves to latest innovative techniques. ICT Centre

The Centre caters to the e-curriculum requirements of computer related practical of various courses in the college. Alongside, the centre also runs a dedicated general purpose computer lab where faculty, students and staff can utilize computing facilities at their convenience. The general purpose lab provides a heterogeneous environment with Windows 7, Mac OS X and Linux Operating System. The Centre also provides a secure Wi-Fi network to all the students, staff and faculty members of the college.

Media Centre

The college has a fully functional Media Centre with high definition equipment and in-house professional expertise to impart pre-production and post-production training to students of Journalism. Besides, it is also used for film screenings, short film making workshops and conducting seminars and conferences on different aspects of media studies and journalism. Live Projects, Industry Interface programmes are the basic characteristics of Media Centre. The College organizes various events in association with Industry partners under the aegis of the media centre.



Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel Auditorium

The high tech auditorium is housed in a separate complex spread over three floors. It has the capacity to accommodate 700 students. Named after the Iron Man of India, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the auditorium is the hub of all cultural and extra-curricular activities at the college. The auditorium has witnessed several high-profile events such as Swami Vivekanand Memorial Annual Lecture Series, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel Memorial Annual Lecture Series, Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Popular Science Lecture Series, 'YUVAAN' the annual cultural fest of the college, several SPIC MACAY performances by International artists notably Polish music and dance artists and Italian Band 'Kora Beat' etc. Prominent dignitaries who addressed the students include Vice President of India Shri M. Vankaiiah Naidu, Hon'ble Governor of Gujarat, Shri O P Kohli, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister of the Government of NCT of Delhi, Shri Manish Sisodia, Hon'ble Minister for Culture of the Government of India to name a few. The auditorium also saw performances by legendary musician Pt. Hari Prasad Chaurasia, Kathak exponent Dr Shovana Narayan, Sarangi Artist Ustad Kamal Sabri and a host of popular artists.



Conference Room



The ultra-modern Conference Room of the College is equipped with large size, ultra-high resolution interactive panel, an excellent sound system, overhead projector and other facilities. The conference room has enabled successful hosting of International, National Conferences and a series of Students Congresses along with facilitating student presentations. The Conference Room has been the venue for several National Conferences, namely, Indian Popular Fiction: Redefining the Canon, Higher Education Institutes: Knowledge Organisations, Reading Migrations: Fractured Histories, Forged Narratives, City Lives: Spaces and Narratives, Student Driven Research for Inspired Learning in Science and Technology, India's Changing Role

in the New World Order, Corporate Social Responsibility: Sports, Olympism and Global Peace, Biodiversity and Climate Change, Media Literacy: Progression and Challenges in Developing Countries and many more.

Vidyottama Girls' Hostel

Vidyottama, the Maharaja Agrasen College hostel offers a safe, secure, and comfortable residence for girls. It offers accommodation for 58 students on three floors with separate areas for dining on the ground floor. Each floor has a pantry with water cooler, washing machine, microwave, ironing facilities, induction stove etc. There is a separate recreational area with a television and provision for indoor and outdoor games as well. The hostel is Wi-Fi enabled and computers are available for the use of the residents.



Admissions to the hostel take place strictly on the basis of merit and the reservation norms are adhered to. Interested outstation girl students should check the college website www.mac.du.ac.in regularly for information regarding admission to the hostel and other queries.

Sports Facilities



Maharaja Agrasen College provides diverse sports facilities with coaching and training in Athletics, Archery, Basketball, Badminton, Chess, Cricket, Cycling, Soccer, Korfball, Softball, Volley Ball and Wushu. The Sports Committee of the College, is in charge of supervising sports activities and organizes various sports and adventure activities regularly for the students, teaching staff and non-teaching staff. The college also organizes its Annual Sports Festival, 'SPARDHA', wherein inter college sports competitions are held. With the aim of encouraging the concept of physical fitness among the students and staff-members, the College has a well-equipped gym (MAC-Wellness Centre), which is accessible to all students and staff-members in the morning hours with an added advantage to the hostel students, since they can access the gym even during the evening. Our future projects

are: 1.Lawn Tennis court with synthetic turf. 2. Viewer's gallery along basketball court. 3. 10 m pistol shooting range. 4. Aarogyam: Herbal garden with yoga and meditation parks and an open gym.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

MAC - NSS, ever since its inception in the year 2013 has been working towards the holistic development of the students. Keeping in view the motto, 'Not Me But You' - an idea which dates back to the times of Mahatma Gandhi who insisted upon social responsibility, the volunteers registered in MAC - NSS unit render community service both inside and outside the college premises. The community service enhances the leadership, organizational and management skills among the students. MAC - NSS allows the students to gain perspective on understanding the association of an individual to one's community and hence develop competencies in sharing of responsibilities among a larger group. MAC - NSS volunteers work in various research projects, on innovative ideas, with villages, slums and voluntary agencies to complete mandatory 120 hours of regular activities during an academic year. Few of the ongoing projects are: Project ABHI (Agrasen Baroji Help Initiative) : Maharaja Agrasen College adopted a village, BAROJI, in Mewat, Haryana, in 2013. Students and faculty visit Baroji several times every year and have worked together with the residents of Baroji closely towards the holistic development of Baroji. 'Tassavvur', the Art and Photography Club as the name suggests encourages interest in all aspects of arts and photography for the benefit of the learning community of University of Delhi and the community at large. Samarthaya , the Equal Opportunity Cell: This platform of MAC-NSS supports specially-abled, SC/ST members and students from economically weaker sections of its learning community and works for equal opportunities, equal rights and respect of each person. Pedal Power Club seeks to maintain physical fitness, explore the great heritage sites of the Delhi and NCR and become more sustainable by decreasing one's environmental impact by raising awareness by riding bicycles and reducing air pollution. Agrani mobilizes young learners and encourages them to advance gender equality and work towards women development, respect of each gender is the main motto of Agrani. Project AKSHAR, is all about imparting education, MAC-NSS Coordinator and student volunteers in this project deliver quality education to the underprivileged children in the vicinity. Approximately 60 to 90 students from nearby slum areas of Dallupura and Kondli are enrolled in this project. A very well designed structure along with all the necessary teaching aids and a highly interactive pedagogical technique are used by the Team AKSHAR. Parent teacher interactions and tests are held regularly to evaluate their progress. The results have been highly encouraging. Syaahi, the writing club of MAC - NSS gives the freedom to the volunteers to express their thoughts on social causes, in form of slogans, poems, shayaris. Sanjaal, the tech wing of MAC - NSS handles the all tech related works of every event, like making posters, photography, presentations, on field tech work, etc and also Sanjaal is itself segregated in 3 sub teams to handle the different social media handles of MAC - NSS, such as the Instagram, Twitter, YouTube and Facebook. Swachhata, works to make the dream of Mahatma Gandhi ji of 'Swachh Bharat', a reality, which got a great push by the honorable PM's initiative of 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan'.



National Cadet Corps (NCC)

NCC is the youth wing of the Indian Armed Forces with its headquarters in New Delhi. NCC is Tri-Services Organization comprising the Army, Navy and Air Wing, engaged in grooming the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens. With its vision to empower volunteer youth to become potential leaders and responsible citizens of the country; it is open to school, college and university students all over India. Discipline and unity are the way of life and with this very motto our prestigious college has introduced NCC Girls unit of Army Wing with the company strength of 160.

At present we have about 100 girl cadets and the unit has been doing different activities such as cleanliness drive, tree plantation, adoption of statues for maintenance, organising different events like expert lecture, international yoga day, environment day etc. Despite being the new raising our cadets are doing very well and they have been selected for All India Annual NCC Trek to Darjeeling and Ajmer and also participated in PM Rally. Cadets are given institutional training in the college. Our cadets have also been selected for National Thal Sainik Camp and Independence Day Camp and are undergoing training at present.



Library



At MAC, the Library is a holistic space to further augment our intellectual acumen. Housed on two floors, it is well furnished with comfortable chairs and tables for students and teachers. It houses more than 44668 books and 135000 e-books on login bases and 5000 e-journals and other important e-resources related to Science and Technology, Social Sciences, Arts and Humanities, Commerce and Management. The library has around 200 (CD/DVDs) audio-visual collection. The library is fully managed by ALICE FOR WINDOW (library automation software). The library is subscribed with N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) which enables the users to access more than 5000 e-journals and e-books through a login username and password.

Students' Union



Following the earlier chapters of the Congress, this present chapter discussed the various dimensions of education within the Indian context. Enumerating on how knowledge functions as power within our quotidian existence, the Congress conducted over two days and spread over six sessions discussed and deliberated on the history, policies, identity politics, and pedagogical shifts in teaching, learning, and syllabus formation as underscored in the National Education Policy 2022 and through past practices. Whether it was in terms of grappling with newer modes of technologies and refashioning our interface with textual pedagogies or in remembering the modes of educational systems of ancient times, this present chapter of the National Student Academic Congress was a timely intervention as it sought to give voice to the many changes that had occurred in the field of education over the past two years because of the pandemic. Students from the undergraduate and postgraduate courses and research scholars from across the country participated in this Congress and shared their views on education so as to prise open the locked doors of our socio-political, cultural, and historical imaginaries.

Shri Sultan Chand Memorial Scholarship

A scholarship of Rupees Three Thousand Five Hundred (3500/-) per annum shall be awarded every year to a student of B.Com Hons. IIIrd year. The scholarship shall be awarded strictly by merit to a student of B.Com Hons III year who secures the second highest percentage of marks, being above Seventy (70% Aggregate of internal and external in all the papers), in the college in B.Com.(Hons) II year University examination in the first attempt in the year immediately preceding.

Apart from above mentioned scholarships, students may also apply for Shri Uggersain Memorial Endowment Scholarship, All India Entrance Scholarship Exams (DU) Entrance Based, Rector's Prize Exam 2016 (DU) Entrance based & Dr. VK Rao Endowment Book Grant.

SC/ST/OBC UGC-Cell

IGNOU

The Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) was established in the year 1985 to impart education by means of distance learning program. IGNOU currently serves approximately 3.5 million students in India. Maharaja Agrasen College is a study center for Post-Graduate and Under-Graduate Courses offered by IGNOU. A special highlight of the IGNOU Program is the Induction Program which orients the students enrolled in the distance learning curriculum. Classes are conducted during weekends for Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA), Bachelor of Commerce (BCOM), Bachelor of Science (B. Sc.), Master of Commerce (M.Com), Management Program (MBA), Master of Art in Hindi (MHD), Master of Arts in Political Science (MPS), Master of Arts in History (MAH), Master of Art in English (MEG), Master in Economics (MEC), Master in Public Administration (MPA), Master in Computer Science (MCA), Master of Science in Mathematics with Application in Computer Science (MSCMACS), Post Graduate Diploma in Journalism and Mass Communication (PGJMC), Diploma in Teaching German (DTG), Certificate in German Language and others.

Centre for Performing Arts and Cultural Studies

Centre for Performing Arts and Cultural Studies (CPACS), Department of English, MAC DU has been promoting performing arts and cultural studies through its focus on live demonstration of theatre based multi-media and cinematic arts since its inception in 2014. The year 2021-22 as has been half online mode and half offline mode, CPACS was actively involved in both the modes to reach MAC students and teachers for bringing connect of performing arts to life situations. During the period of pandemic, CPACS was engaged with bringing news of online availability of performing arts events, workshops and training links to develop engagement with performing arts for stories of resilience, health and care including mit-press-journal TDR / The Drama Review Students' Essay contest info and guidance. The link of live performance by Asmita 'Godse @ Gandhi.Com', a fiction fantasy play by Ashgar Vajahat, was shared on 30th January 2022 to promote online play watching. The play is a fictional-fantasy dialogue between the two historical figures. Another significant online event attended and shared by CPACS was the official launch of the Pandit Jasraj Cultural Foundation with an address by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India and Video messages from distinguished Musicians viz. Pt. Shivkumar Sharma, Padma Vibhushan; Pt. Hariprasad Chaurasia, Padma Vibhushan; Ustad Amjad Ali Khan, Padma Vibhushan; Dr. L Subramaniam, Padma Bhushan; Dr. N Rajam, Padma Bhushan.

After DU's return from online to campus mode of teaching, CPACS has been imparting skills and customized workshops on basics of music, theatre, photography and cinematography to interested students whether as individuals or groups. During MAC visit to Sikkim Univ. for educational and cultural exchange, CPACS Coordinator and Activity Director Vinod Verma conducted a three days workshop 'Kangchenjunga' on photography and cinematography for a group of students who were documenting the tour through camera.

To promote theatrical activities, CPACS shared info of majestic musical play Babasaheb : The Grand Musical presented by the Government of Delhi from 25th February 2022 to 12th March 2022. CPACS disseminated the info on the play and musical theatre with students and staff members of MAC, arranged tickets for the show and some teachers and students of MAC watched the Musical 4 pm show on 10th March 2022.



Smart Class Rooms



Maharaja Agrasen College added another feather in its cap and paved way for next generation teaching-learning system by creating six smart classrooms in its premises. The smart classrooms are in line with the college's aim of providing holistic and quality education to all its students.

These classrooms will enhance virtual learning and teaching environments by offering real-time e-learning ambience, with help of audios and videos, multimedia images, online web conferences, PPT presentations, 2D & 3D animations, etc. This leads to the emergence of a more inclusive and

interactive teaching-learning scenario. This new age teaching-learning system will help in coalescing virtual and in-classroom teaching methodologies in multiple and innovative ways to afford easy accessibility for all. The smart classrooms were inaugurated by Vice Chancellor of University of Delhi, Prof P.C. Joshi on 10 September 2021 in presence of Dean of Colleges, Prof Balaram Pani, Principal, Prof Sanjeev Kumar Tiwari and other staff members of the college.

Sanskriti Kala Kendra

The Hindi Department had started a Sanskriti Kala Kendra with the aim of the overall development of the students. Besides giving them academic knowledge, the centre focuses to inculcate cultural and moral values among the students. Maharaja Agrasen College has initiated a long-term educational and cultural exchange program with Tokyo University of Foreign Studies, Tokyo, Japan. Environmental Club

The Cell in collaboration with the Sports Committee organised an 'Inter-College Chess Competition' on 12 April 2022 and 13 April 2022. The said competition was inclusive in nature as it invited participation from both able-bodied persons and persons with visual disabilities. The Cell in collaboration with the Training and Placement Cell organised a workshop on 'CV making and How to appear in job interviews' for students with disabilities on 25 April 2022. Further, eight PwD students with four TPC student volunteers and TPC teacher coordinator Dr. Sachin Kumar went to participate in the Mega Job Fair (for students with disabilities) organised by School of Open Learning, University of Delhi on 26 April 2022. Three PwD students got job offers from organisations like Concentrix, My Moneymintra and IBM. The Cell collaborated with the Training and Placement Cell of the college to organise a 'Mega Job Fair' for persons with disabilities in association with the Samarthanam Trust in the college campus on 25 May 2022. The Cell also works to develop and facilitate counselling, assistive technology, accessible infrastructure and inclusive pedagogy for persons with disabilities in the college premises. The Cell is committed towards taking initiatives for the inclusion of persons with disability in the mainstream of college community.

Abdul Kalam Centre

List of Documents Required for Admission

The Candidates shall be required to upload copies of the following certificates/documents at the time of registration and produce the documents in original at the time of physical verification at the end of the admissions process.

1. Class X Certificate (Mark-sheet or certificate) indicating date of birth and Parents' names & XII Mark-Sheet.
2. SC/ST/OBC/EWS/CW/KM Certificate (in the applicant's name) issued by the competent authority. (The names of applicants claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBC/EWS/CW/KM must match with the names that appear on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates; similarly, their parents' names must match in both sets of certificates).
3. OBC (Non-Creamy Layer) Certificate (in the name of the applicant) issued by the competent authority, and wherein the caste is in the OBC central list issued by <http://ncbc.nic.in>. (The name of the applicant claiming reservation under OBC (Non-Creamy Layer) must match with the applicant's name as it appears on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates; similarly, their parents' names must match in both sets of certificates). As stipulated, an income certificate for the financial year 2021-22, dated on or after March 31, 2022, will be required. The format of the OBC certificate is as per the DOPT certificate issued in 2014 (Appendix V of the University of Delhi, Bulletin of Information).
4. EWS Certificate (Appendix IV of the University of Delhi, Bulletin of Information) from competent authority certifying the applicant can claim reservation under this category. (The names of applicants claiming reservation under this category must match with the names that appear on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates; similarly, their parents' names must match in both sets of certificates). Income certificate for the financial year 2021-22, dated on or after March 31, 2022, as stipulated, is required.

Admission Procedure

Step I: Appearing in CUET-UG 2022.

For the academic year 2022-23, admission to all UG Programs of UoD will be done based on the Common University Entrance Test- Under-Graduate 2022 (CUET (UG) - 2022). CUET(UG) - 2022 was conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) in July-August 2022.

Step II: Registration in CSAS – 2022

Appearing in CUET(UG) - 2022 will not be a sufficient condition to secure a seat in Maharaja Agrasen College. For admission to the College UG Programs, a candidate has to apply in Common Seat Allocation System (CSAS-2022) of University of Delhi. Determination of program-specific eligibility and verification of documents for admission to MAC will be the sole purview of the college/university.

All applicants desirous of taking admission to Maharaja Agrasen College must give the preferences of MAC and the programs offered by the college in CSAS – 2022.

The candidate must refer to the Programs offered by MAC, their Program-Specific Eligibility Criteria, the seat matrix of each program offered by the college, fee structure and other relevant information published on the college website and the admission website of UoD before selecting the Program + College preferences.

Step II: Registration in CSAS – 2022

The CSAS -2022 form will be deemed submitted only when the applicant has paid the relevant registration fee. This fee must be paid only through the link provided through the applicant's Dashboard.

Step III: Seat Allocation

The University of Delhi will provisionally allocate seats to applicants during the various allocation rounds. The applicants must 'Accept' the allocated seat and apply for admission to MAC. The college will then verify the documents and approve the admission. For details, please refer to CSAS - 2022 document available at: https://admission.uod.ac.in/userfiles/downloads/12092022_CSAS.pdf

Step IV: Selection of Course and College

Upon seat allocation, applicants must log in to their Dashboards to Accept the program and college allocated.

- i. Please note that 'Accept' option to apply in the college as per allocated seat can be made only online through their Dashboard on the UG admissions portal. There will be no physical visit to the colleges at this point in the process.
- ii. The procedure for accepting the allocated seat by the applicant must be completed within the stipulated time interval.

Step V: Online verification of documents by respective colleges

The college shall verify the documents uploaded by the applicant for the program-specific eligibility, minimum eligibility and category. Those approved are required to pay the fee and receive a confirmation of their admission.

Step VI: Payment of fees to confirm admission

Once the Principal of the College has approved their admission, the applicants will receive a link on their Dashboard through which they must submit the program fees due. This fee can only be paid online through the portal.

- i. The applicant must pay the fee without delay within the stipulated time,. On successful payment of fees, the applicant is granted provisional admission to the said college.
- ii. Applicants must pay the fee within the timeframe allocated, failing which it will be concluded that the applicant is not interested in the program of study at that college, and the candidate will be out of CSAS - 2022.

Step VII: Physical verification of the original documents

The respective colleges will verify the uploaded documents within the stipulated time (Dates for the same shall be announced by the University / College later). If, at this stage, it is found that the information given by the applicant is false and/or is not supported by the documents presented, the admission will be immediately cancelled. No fees will be refunded in such cases. Any change in the admission process for CSAS – 2022 UG admission will be notified on the website of the University of Delhi. Candidates applying to the University of Delhi must refer to the UG BoI-2022 for Common Minimum Eligibility criteria and Program-Specific Eligibility criteria. (http://du.ac.in/uploads/new-web/21042022_BOI-UG.pdf).

If at any stage original documents relating to the admission of a candidate are found to be fake / non-genuine or fabricated or in any other manner defective, the said candidate will not be admitted. If already admitted, admission will be cancelled without any prior notice in this regard. If the same is found after completing the program, his / her degree will be cancelled and appropriate legal action will be taken.

Qualifying Examinations:

Qualifying examinations for admission to the first year of undergraduate programs offered by the University of Delhi shall be Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination (Class XII) of the Central Board of Secondary Education or an examination recognized as equivalent.

Age Requirement:

As per Ordinance-I of the University of Delhi, there is no minimum age bar for admission for the courses offered by the college.

ORDINANCE XV-B: Maintenance of Discipline among Students of the University

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor/Principal of the College.
2. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - a. Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution / Department and against any student within the University of Delhi
 - b. Carrying of, use of or threat to use of any weapons
 - c. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976
 - d. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes
 - e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women
 - f. Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner
 - g. Willful destruction of institutional property
 - h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds
 - i. Disrupting in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system;
 - j. Prohibition of Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of her/his powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to her/him appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor / Principal, may in the exercise of her/his powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students–
 - (a) be expelled; or
 - (b) be, for a stated period rusticated; or
 - (c) be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme or programmes of study in the College or

- (d) be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
 - (e) be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which she / he or they have appeared be cancelled.
4. The Principals of the College shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges, Institutions, Faculties and Teaching Departments in the University as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Institutions. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.
 5. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor/Principal as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself / herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he /she submits himself / herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor/Principal and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules that have been framed there in by the University.

ORDINANCE XV-C: Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College / Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. 'Ragging' for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
 - a. Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force.
 - b. Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students.
 - c. Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe.
 - d. Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
 - e. Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Not with standing anything in Clause above, the Principal may also suo moto to enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the GB/Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Principal of the College may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/ she may so advise the GB / Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/ her decision shall be final.
9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3 (a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
10. The Vice-chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
11. In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of the University of Delhi are found guilty; under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees or diploma conferred by the University.
12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
13. All Institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions /directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

ORDINANCE XV-D/The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace

(Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (MINISTRY OF LAW AND JUSTICE)

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at work place and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected there with incidental there to.

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment;

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June, 1993 by the Government of India.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at workplace. For details, please see the website <http://www.shebox.nic.in/assets/site/main/images/Sexual-Harassment-at-Workplace-Act.pdf>.

The carefully designed syllabus aims at giving wider coverage to its course contents, enabling easier assimilation of the same by the students. The department adopts various pedagogical approaches apart from the regular lectures, tutorials, project work, and presentations. The department organizes industrial seminars and workshops regularly. It encourages students to take up internships in industry and research establishments etc., with the aim of developing their problem-solving, communication, and higher-order skills of reasoning and analysis. The activity calendar of the department broadly comprises an orientation program for the freshers, corporate interactions, and workshops on several contemporary topics, majorly for developing leadership attributes, soft skills, start-up ideation and funding, business innovation, and so on.



The department organizes an 'Industrial colloquium' to impart skills in situation-based decision-making, trading, and optimal utilization of given budgetary resources. The B.A. Honours course in English at Maharaja Agrasen College was introduced in 1997. This is a highly sought-after course and justly so. With an entire panorama of literary texts, contexts and critical tools, it aims to provide students an exposure to a spectrum of global literatures and train them in various methods of literary and sociocultural analyses. The department has consistently provided opportunities to students for interacting with some of the best minds in the discipline as well as in allied fields. It has systems in place to ensure delivery of quality teaching, transparent mechanisms for internal assessment and structured preparation for University examination as well as orientation for future preparation for diverse fields and professions. To apply research to classroom teaching, an interfaculty lecture series project (ILSP) has been initiated since the session 2020-21. Furthermore, it has a full calendar of activities aimed towards making students connect not just with the literary world but also with the larger world beyond their classroom ambit. The Department has its own departmental library, a growing digital archive, as well as a rich reserve of resource in its Centre for Performing Arts and Cultural Studies (CPACS). Implementing NEP from the academic session 2022-23, the structure and syllabi of DU English courses under UGCF scheme have been designed by incorporating inputs from well researched areas worldwide providing these



courses clarity of course statements, academic and job oriented objectives , facilitating the achievements of course , essential readings, weekly teaching plans and keywords. Besides core courses on literary studies, the framework of the degree also includes courses on skill / ability enhancement, discipline specific electives, generic elective and a wide range of exposure to activities associated with teaching-learning exercises of these courses. To facilitate the achievements of course learning outcomes, the department applies the model of teaching-learning as included in syllabus which clearly demarcates a participatory three pillar approach consisting of 1. Course Learning Outcomes 2. Teaching and Learning Activity and 3. Assessment Tasks. To lay theoretical foundation for the course the emphasis is on understanding concepts, expressing concepts through writing, and demonstrating conceptual and textual understanding in tests and exams. Teaching-learning activity comprises of interactive discussions in small groups in tutorial classes, how to think critically and write with clarity and discussions on exam questions and answering techniques. The assessment tasks include reading material together in small groups, initiating discussion topics, participation in discussions, writing essay length assignments and class tests. The Department, thus is a stimulating, vibrant space, providing ample opportunities for students to explore their potentials and the possibilities made available to them in the intellectual, academic, creative, as well as social arenas.

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The B.A (H) Journalism course aims at foregrounding the role of journalism in a democracy. It helps the students to refine their linguistic and communicative skills while providing an insight into the socio-economic and political dimensions of living in a globalized world.

A host of interesting and practical subjects like the history of journalism and printing, social psyche and mass culture, news making, advertising and public relations are covered in the course to give the student a firm foundation for a competitive industry. Understanding the importance of practical experiences required in this field, this course has been designed to give maximum exposure to the students and thereby familiarize them with the on-ground skills and abilities required. Another crucial aspect of journalism relies on the community interaction and therefore the department regularly organizes Community Development Programs. Our students visit rural communities and try to understand their problems, opinions and the requisite needs of the societies. Department organizes talks, lectures and symposiums on various issues, which exposes students to the words of eminent achievers in the media industry. Apart from inviting media professional to the college, the students of the college are taken to various media houses to help them in becoming acquainted with the industry, its functioning and requirements.

While the course focuses on journalism and news media, it is no way limited to it. The course provides ample skills to students for varied fields like radio, advertising and public relations, photography, filmmaking, etc. And even in these fields, the course enables the student to choose their interests, be it on-screen or off-screen professions by imparting an ample skill set for both.



Event management is an important aspect of this industry and therefore the Department organizes the annual Journalism Festival 'Yatharth'. The fest is largely organized by the students with the faculty as their guiding light. Department also regularly publishes its much-acclaimed newsletter, 'MAC VOICE'. The entire process of editing and designing is carried out solely by the students, so that they understand the concepts of Journalism from news gathering to circulation while honing their skills for the news media industry.

The course's wide-ranging focus and industrial relevance is characterized by our alumni who have made a name for themselves across various fields. Our alumni are working across the globe with famed news organisations like Wall Street Journal, Reuters, Al Jazeera, BBC, etc. While Doordarshan, India TV, Zee Media, CNN-News18 Group, NDTV, Republic Media, TV Today Network, etc. are some Indian media organisations where our alumni are proving their mettle.

Apart from broadcast media, MACites have a significant presence in print media too. Pioneer, The Telegraph, The Indian Express and Financial Express, The Hindu and Businessline, The Times of India, Hindustan Times and Hindustan, etc. to name a few.

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The Department of Political Science was established in the year 1994. The department offers B.A. (Hons.) in Political Science to students. The department also teaches students of B.A. Prog. (Political Science) and offers variety of paper to them. The existing curriculum for Political Science papers in B.A. Prog. is also available on the DU website. The department also offers interdisciplinary Generic Elective (GE) papers for other Honours courses. There are a total number of ten faculty members currently employed with the department. The faculty has varied interests across the discipline ranging from Political Theory, Nationalism, Foreign Policy, African Politics, South Asian Politics, Human Rights, Public Administration, Indian Diaspora etc. 'Chanakya' is the Political Science student society of Maharaja Agrasen College that aims at providing services that enable students to develop their full potential and to reach their educational goals. Chanakya society organizes its Annual Fest in the month of September each year where various competitions like Slam Poetry, Political Quiz, Just a Minute, Political Caricature, Funk from Junk which was to encourage students to Make Best out of the Waste, Ek din ka Mantri where participants were given the role of a minister and Drollery-stand-up comedy, poster making, extempore, Multilevel debates, essay writing, mock elections etc. are held to provide a learning atmosphere to the students of the department. 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The Department of Electronic Science, Maharaja Agrasen College, a distinguished leader in technical education, offers the undergraduate program, B.Sc.(H) Electronics, where the teaching of applied, hands-on electronics is of the utmost importance. This course is designed to enhance the students' understanding of scientific principles and to further develop their technical skills by hands-on designing and testing of electronic circuits and systems similar to that are used in industry. The course curriculum is a perfect blend of papers in physics, mathematics, and computer with special emphasis on electronics. Basic concepts of computer modeling and simulation of electronic circuits are an integral part of curriculum. Students are also trained in fundamental computational skills to use techniques and software for simulation, data analysis and visualization more efficiently. Overall, this course is an integrated approach to electronics and computer science, taught using substantial laboratory experiments in areas such as analog, digital, signal & systems, communication, optoelectronics, microprocessor, microcontroller, robotics, embedded systems, VLSI design, etc.

This well-structured program enhances student's employability skills and also their ability to articulate these skills. Electronics graduates and post graduates have a bright future ahead of them in various areas like Design, Development, Fabrication, Inspection, Quality control and Maintenance.

Students possessing a scientific temperament, strong back-ground in physics and mathematics; having high acceptance of new technologies and good reasoning abilities are most likely to excel in this field.



The new proposed UG structure opens up abundant opportunities because of its unique designing as students will be able to study more number of core papers to enhance their fundamental understanding in Electronics, new skill sets as per industry 4.0/5.0 standards through Skill enhancement papers and a number of discipline specific electives to nurture their knowledge in their areas of interest as per the electronics industry demand. This new structure will go a long way in providing students with desired knowledge and skills to be industry employable, entrepreneur and capable researchers. The Electronics curriculum is designed and developed in a way that will fulfill the objectives of NEP.

B. Sc. Physical Science

B.Sc Physical Science is a versatile course. It is both fascinating and provides wider scope for analytical thinking, creativity, fundamental research and of course employment.



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Courses of Study – Courses of study indicates pursuance of study in a particular discipline. Every discipline shall offer three categories of courses of study, viz. Discipline Specific Core courses (DSCs), Discipline Specific Electives (DSEs) and Generic Electives (GEs).

a) Discipline Specific Core (DSC): Discipline Specific Core is a course of study, which should be pursued by a student as a mandatory requirement of his/her programme of study. DSCs shall be the core credit courses of that particular discipline which will be appropriately graded and arranged across the semesters of study, being undertaken by the student, with multiple exit options as per NEP 2020. The DSCs specified in the framework would be identified by the concerned Department as core courses to be taught in a Programme.

b) Generic Elective (GE): Generic Electives shall be a pool of courses which is meant to provide multidisciplinary or interdisciplinary education to students. GEs shall consist of a pool of courses offered by various disciplines of study (excluding the GEs offered by the parent discipline), in groups of odd and even semesters, from which a student can choose. In case a student opts for DSEs beyond his/her discipline specific course(s) of study, such DSEs shall be treated as GEs for that student.

c) Ability Enhancement course : (AEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) & Value Addition Course (VAC)

- (i) AEC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement through various areas of study. They are Language and Literature and Environmental Science and Sustainable Development which will be mandatory for all disciplines.
- (ii) SEC courses are skill-based courses in all disciplines and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc. SEC courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide skill-based instruction.
- (iii) VAC courses are value-based courses which are meant to inculcate ethics, culture, Indian Knowledge systems, constitutional values, soft skills, sports education and such similar values to students which will help in all round development of students.

Besides, the name of the Student Society of B.Sc. Physical Science is “Vigyanmanthan”. Various Competitions, Lecture series are organised by the department during its annual cultural meet “Scintilla” to enhance students’ overall growth.



Attendance

1. All courses taught in the college shall be taught in the Semester System as per University of Delhi Guidelines and Curricula.
2. According to Ordinance VII (2)* of the University of Delhi, a candidate for the Semester I/III/V Examination shall not be deemed to have satisfied the required conditions of attendance unless s/he has attended, in all the subjects taken together, not less than two thirds of the lectures/practical/presentations/tutorials required to be attended provided that a student of the Semester I/III/V who does not fulfil the required conditions of attendance, as above, but has attended, in all the subjects taken together, not less than 40 percent of lectures/practical/presentations during the respective semester, may at the discretion of the Principal of the College concerned, appear for the ensuing semester Examination; but such a candidate shall be required to make up the deficiency at lectures and practical, in the next semester of the same academic year.
3. Provided that a student of the II/IV semester who does not fulfill the required conditions of attendance as above, but has attended in all the subjects taken together, not less than 40 per cent of the lectures/practical/presentation/tutorials, held during the respective semester, may at the discretion of the Principal of the College concerned, be allowed to appear in the ensuing examination provided that s/he makes up the deficiency of the said attendance by combining the attendance of the previous semester in the ensuing semester.
4. The assessment marks for attendance are assigned as per the following guidelines:
Less than 67% (0 Mark), More than 67% but less than 70% (1 Mark), More than 70% but less than 75% (2 Marks), More than 75% but less than 80% (3 Marks), More than 80% but less than 85% (4 Marks), More than 85% (5 Marks).
